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THE SMALL GYM SUMMIT CHAMPIONSHIP DATES

The Small Gym Summit Championship will be held at the Walt Disney World Resort's ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, FL May 6th and May 7th, 2027.

Division splits will be completed when registration is FINAL – divisions are not guaranteed to split and will be done based on USASF guidelines.

Divisions will not be split DI/DII.

*These divisions may be combined based on FINAL registration with the corresponding All-Girl division.

**These divisions do not split by size.

CROSSOVER POLICY

Athletes are not allowed to compete on more than two cheer teams at The Small Gym Summit. Athletes Level 6 and below may crossover up or down two levels at The Small Gym Summit.

- Exception: L4.2 can only crossover to L2, L3, and/or L4.
- Exception - Athletes who compete at The Cheerleading Worlds in a Non-Tumbling division can also compete in a Summit Championships division in Level 4.2.

Reminder: Time considerations for crossover conflicts during the Final Rounds of competition at The Small Gym Summit are not guaranteed.

COMPETING AT THE CHEERLEADING WORLDS AND THE SMALL GYM SUMMIT

The maximum number of athletes allowed to compete at The 2027 Cheerleading Worlds and The Small Gym Summit will be 8 athletes per team.

Athletes who compete at The Cheerleading Worlds may only compete in a Summit division in levels 4, 5, and/or 6.

Exception - Athletes who compete at The Cheerleading Worlds in a Non-Tumbling division may also compete in a Summit division in level 4.2.

Athletes competing with a program at The Cheerleading Worlds may represent a different program at The Summit, D2 Summit and Small Gym Summit with an Athlete Release, turned into Registration. These athletes will still be considered "Worlds" athletes as it pertains to the Crossover Policy.

COMPETING AT THE SUMMIT, THE D2 SUMMIT & THE SMALL GYM SUMMIT

Athletes are permitted to compete at The Summit or The D2 Summit and the Small Gym Summit. Entire teams are not eligible to compete at The Summit or The D2 Summit AND The Small Gym Summit. Athletes competing at multiple events will not be considered crossovers as these are different events.

Small Gym teams can attend The Summit OR The Small Gym Summit; The D2 Summit OR The Small Gym Summit. Programs are able to split teams across the events permitted they follow the Small Gym Summit guidelines as detailed.

Example: A L1 Small Junior – D2 team from a D2 Program can attend either The D2 Summit OR The Small Gym Summit – they cannot attend both, permitted they fall under the Small Gym distinction.

An athlete from the L1 Small Junior – D2 team can attend The D2 Summit with one team and The Small Gym Summit with another team, but they will not be considered a crossover, as they are 2 different events.

TEAM ELIGIBILITY

Any team that competes AND receives a bid in one of the above divisions to The Small Gym Summit at a qualifying event in the 2026 - 2027 season. Teams must be in good standing with the USASF & Varsity Spirit.

Teams MUST compete in the same division in which they qualified for but are allowed to add up to the MAXIMUM number of athletes in the division. For example, a team qualifying with 16 athletes may compete at The Small Gym Summit with up to 22 athletes.

Teams that qualify in a coed division but no longer meet the roster requirements for coed **will NOT** be eligible to compete in the comparable all girl division, and vice versa. Should this situation arise, teams will be required to compete for a new bid.

Should a situation arise where a Coed team loses their Coed status POST final bid deadline, teams are required to compete in the Coed division and still maintain the Coed scoring requirement. All-Girl teams will not be permitted to add a boy and compete in an all-girl division.

D2 ELIGIBILITY AT THE SUMMIT CHAMPIONSHIPS

The following USASF Program definition and classification will be followed:

USASF Member Profile for Division Eligibility (program size) All athletes are associated with a single USASF program profile. The member database will count the total number of competitive cheer athletes in the PROGRAM to determine

the program size. Programs with 125 or fewer athletes will qualify for Division II when Division II is an option at that particular event. Programs with 125 or fewer athletes may, through their member profile, opt-in to Division I. Once a program opts-in and/or competes as a Division I program, they must remain Division I for the remainder of the season.

SMALL GYM SUMMIT ELIGIBILITY

Programs that are eligible for The Small Gym Summit are programs and/or locations of gyms with 60 Elite athletes or less rostered in USASF. Eligibility will be confirmed with the USASF throughout the season with final eligibility requirements established prior to the Final Registration deadline.

Additional parameters will be as follows: Franchise locations qualify only if coaches and athletes are not shared across locations; International teams (Non-US) will not be eligible.

When calculating D2 or Small Gym Summit eligibility, Varsity reserves the right to include any athletes enrolled in the program without USASF Athlete Membership competing at non-USASF events when determining the number of athletes enrolled in your program that defines your D2 or Small Gym Summit eligibility.

SCORING AT THE SMALL GYM SUMMIT

Scoring at The Small Gym Summit for all divisions will be on the Varsity All Star scoring system using the United Scoring System.

BID INFORMATION

WILD CARD BIDS

Wild Card Bids allow teams to compete in Prelims. Wild Card Bid winners must pay the full balance to compete. *Wild Card Bids are not given in International Divisions.

AT LARGE BIDS

At-Large Bids allow teams to forego Prelims and advance straight to Semi-Finals. At-Large Bid winners must pay the full balance to compete.

PARTIAL PAID BIDS

Partial Paid Bids allow teams to forego Prelims and advance straight to Semi-Finals. Partial Paid Bid winners will pay a portion of the balance to compete.

*If additional athletes are added to the roster after the Partial Paid Bid was earned, the gym is responsible for the full cost of the additional athletes.

The allocation of monetary bids awarded to rostered athletes is at the sole discretion of the gym competing.

FULL PAID BIDS

Paid Bids allow teams to forego Prelims and advance straight to Semi-Finals. Paid Bid winners will be given priority in the performance order for Semi-Finals with the exception of crossover conflicts.

*If additional athletes are added to the roster after the Paid Bid was earned, the gym is responsible for the full cost of the additional athletes.

The allocation of monetary bids awarded to rostered athletes is at the sole discretion of the gym competing.

EARNING TWO BIDS IN THE SAME DIVISION

A program location can't earn two bids in the same Summit division. The only exception to this would be if the program location has a second legitimate team. To be considered "legitimate", this team may not share ANY athletes with the team already in possession of a Summit Bid regardless of registration status.

PASSING DOWN BIDS

Summit Bids will not be passed down. For example, if a team receives an At-Large Bid at an event early in the season and upgrades to a Paid Bid later in the season, the original At-Large Bid will not be given to another team. This bid will be eliminated.

UPGRADING BIDS

- Wild Card Bids can be upgraded to a Partial Paid OR a Paid Bid.
- At-Large Bids can be upgraded to a Partial Paid OR a Paid Bid.
- Partial Paid bids can only be upgraded to a Paid Bid.
- Paid Bids must be used and cannot be upgraded.

BID ELIGIBILITY

Event Producers have the right to investigate any teams receiving a bid to The Small Gym Summit. Bid eligible teams and divisions will be reviewed for accuracy and legitimacy. Any bid eligible team/athlete found in violation of a USASF, IASF or Varsity Spirit policy may be disqualified.

BID ACCEPTANCE AT EVENTS

Teams will not be able to accept bids to The Summit/The D2 Summit AND The Small Gym Summit at the same qualifying event. During registration at the qualifying event, Programs will fill out the Bid Intention Sheet – where teams will decide which Bid-event they would like attempt to earn a bid for.

Example: A L1 Small Junior – D2 team from a D2 Program can choose to accept either The D2 Summit bid OR The Small Gym Summit bid at a Qualifying event– they cannot accept both bids at the same qualifying event, permitted they fall under the Small Gym distinction.

ROUNDS AND ADVANCEMENTS

Prelims:

Teams who receive a Wildcard bid will compete in Prelims. The top 5 scoring teams in each division will automatically advance to the Finals. In divisions with less than 5 teams, all will advance to Finals.

Semi-Finals:

Teams who receive an At Large, Partial Paid or Paid Bid will compete in Semi-Finals. The number of teams advancing to Finals from Semi-Finals will be based on 50% of the division competing on the day of competition but will be no fewer than 5 teams and no more than 10 teams.

For CheerABILITIES:

CheerABILITIES teams will compete twice at The Small Gym Summit. All teams will advance to the 2nd day.

Finals:

Teams who advance from Prelims and Semi-Finals will compete in the Finals. For the performance order in

Finals, will be advancing teams from Wildcard division alternating with teams advancing from the Semi-Finals round.

Regardless of placement, ties will not be broken at The Summit Championships, nor will ties impact the number of teams advancing in each round of competition. Exception: if there is a tie for the last and final team advancing, both teams will advance.

REVEALS

A Summit Reveal is a ceremony it is announced who will be advancing to the final round. Live attendance is encouraged but not mandatory. Reveals will be broadcast live & free on Varsity TV.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

All participants will receive a commemorative medallion.

Teams who hit zero on their first day of competition will receive a Peak Performance Plaque at their Reveal.

Teams who qualify for Finals on Sunday in each division will be awarded a team banner with division and placement.

Teams that place 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in their respective division will receive a team banner and each participant will receive individual mini banners recognizing their accomplishment.

All divisional champions will receive exclusive Summit Championship Rings! Teams will receive their team size plus an additional 6 rings to distribute how they see fit. Additional rings may be ordered on-site & must be paid for by the team or individual before delivery.

VARSITY SPIRIT PROGRAM RELEASE WAIVER

All athletes participating on a team at The 2027 Small Gym Summit must be a registered member of that team's program during the 2026 - 2027 competition season. Any athlete that exhibitions or competes on the floor with a team in any level from a program (Primary Program) after January 1, 2027 must have a [Varsity Spirit Program Release Waiver](#) signed by the owner of the Primary Program before that athlete is eligible to compete with another program at The 2027 Summit Championships.

Completion of the Varsity Spirit Program Release Waiver is a required process between the Primary and Secondary Program owners. In the event a formal protest is made and the official Program Release Waiver has not been signed, or if the Secondary Program is not able to provide one as physical proof to a Varsity Official, the Secondary Program will not be eligible or will be disqualified depending on the time of the formal protest. All [Varsity Spirit Program Release Waivers](#) must be turned in with your official USASF event roster at The Small Gym Summit.

VARSITY SPIRIT EVENT RULES & REGULATIONS

By participating in The Summit Championship all teams agree to abide by all rules and regulations. Any team that does not adhere may be subject to disqualification and automatically forfeit any right to any prizes or awards presented by The Summit. In addition, teams may also forfeit the opportunity to participate the following year.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Varsity Spirit encourages and supports sportsmanship, integrity and fairness among participants and coaches/owners/directors in all facets of team practice and performance. We strive to uphold the highest standards and promote this to the best of our abilities and believe that coaches are instrumental in promoting and instilling this among their respective team members.

To ensure the most positive experience for all attendees, Varsity Spirit asks that all participants, coaches, gym owners, directors and spectators adhere to and know the Code of Conduct and Prohibited Items for all Regional, Virtual, and Championships events.
